Kimble Lake Homeowners Association Meeting Minutes May 28, 2016

Chairman Maas summarized the President's Report by commenting on the importance of the assistance and financial support that members of the Association have given throughout the years. He commended all members and volunteers regarding this support.

Jane Maas reported on the Sunshine Committee and indicated only 2 cards were sent out this last year. She also indicated to be sure and contact her if anyone knew of residents that needed to be contacted.

Arlen Johnson reported on the water quality of the lake and commented on the handout indicating the clarity and depth of Kimble compared to other lakes in the area. Kimble's water quality is still ranked excellent.

Larry Knutson reported on the fish stocking in Kimble. Larry indicated in years past that lake trout and muskies were stocked, however, currently walleye stocking is the priority. Walleye stocking will take place again during 2017-18.

Jim Schultz reported on the AIS Committee and the current activities and schedule of the access monitoring. He also reported that a porta poddy has been added at the landing for access monitoring use.

Chairman Maas announced the election of new board members for the 2016-17. There were no write-ins therefore new members are Jim Rusch and Jan Lodico. Congratulations!

Jim Rusch introduced our featured speaker, Marv Koep, well known resident and fishing guide in the area. Marv talked about guiding in the area and how fishing has changed over the years. His presentation was greatly appreciated.
