Loon Nests Again in Place

Once again, two loon nesting platforms have been placed on our lake by the KLHA. The most occupied location is again on the south shore of the western most bay of the lake. Another is located in the east bay, close to Cty. Hwy. 39.

At least one pair of loons has been observed on the lake, maybe two. At any rate, by the time you read this report one or both may be laying eggs for an early June hatch. All lake traffic should respect and stay a good distance from the nests, especially prior to hatching. We have had a very successful loon breeding program over the past several years. Let's all make 2010 another loon-family-on-the-lake year!

New Bouys, Same Locations

New safety bouys have been placed on the lake by Larry Knutson at a cost of \$537 to the KLHA. Boaters, please observe theses bouys and stay away from them for the safety of your passengers and prevention of damage to your boats.

Larry reports that several of the old bouys show signs of damage, perhaps from errant boat hulls. Please observe these safety warnings, but keep your distance from them.
