Losing Our Baby Loons

We are saddened that our baby loons did not make it for more than a day or two on our lake. We've been looking into what may have happened to them, beyond attributing it to eagles. Kevin Kenow, a research wildlife biologist and speaker at a recent WAPOA meeting, shared this with some of our lake members about the loss:

Chick loss during territory takeover attempts seems entirely likely. Here is a description of physical interactions of common loons from the Birds of North America online series.

Physical Interactions are more common in spring when birds of both sexes actively defend their territories. Contests can escalate and result in fatality for one of the combatants; however, injuries and deaths are far more common in males than females.

Underwater attacks occur by swimming directly under the opponent and impaling the victim. Above water attacks typically do not end in fatality, but rather with one of the individuals being chased off. Chases can be long, aggressive, with much jabbing and striking of bills.

Battles usually involve a sequence of aggressive encounters: 1) repeated splash-diving between two contestants, until one lunges at the other and grabs its head in its bill; 2) reciprocal beating of each bird with the wings of the other until one individual, exhausted, is unable to continue; and 3) weaker bird's head is often held underwater by the stronger followed by surrender by the weaker bird, which escapes (often pursued across the water by the stronger) until it takes refuge on land or in a distant part of the territory. In males, such violent bouts apparently often end in death by drowning of the weaker combatant. If a territory with chicks is taken over by a male, the chicks are usually killed.
